Adopt A Grandparent Program

Long Term Care Facility Procedure Information

- 1. Develop specific criteria for planning and carrying out the Adopt A Grandparent Program.
 - a. Identify the group (day cares, Scout groups, church groups, 4-H groups, local school, etc.) and age group of students your facility would like to target for the Adopt A Grandparent program.
 - b. Introduce the program to all group leaders in the identified group. Identify one person to be the main point of contact between the group and long term care facility.
 - c. Gather student numbers from participating group. Group students 2-3 per resident. Identify number of facility residents needed to participate in the program.
 - d. Set up time frames for visits with group leaders: specific days, time, and length of visits.
 - e. Provide training to groups prior to first meeting. Training might include information about resident rights, infection control, communication techniques, hearing/visual issues and center policies (example: HIPAA)
- 2. Identify residents through a process who would benefit from participating in the program. Approach each resident for consent; include information in care plan meetings, if appropriate. Ask residents to sign a participation and photo/video consent form.
 - a. Advise residents that activities will be held in a central location. Ask residents not to give students anything.
 - b. Remind residents that snacks will be provided by the facility for residents and students.
- 3. Evaluate each visit for needed changes, additional training and resident participation involvement.
- 4. Communicate any necessary changes or information to specific individuals participating in the program. (example: resident hospital admittance, discharges and deaths)
- 5. Document student and resident participation.
