Founded on the twin pedestals of education and social events, the NDSU Women's Club offers a rich history.

NDSU Women's Club is a nonprofit educational organization whose purpose is to enhance relationships within the University and surrounding communities.

The Club began in 1920, when NDSU was still North Dakota Agricultural College, and was originally composed primarily of faculty wives and the few women members of the college staff. A written or verbal invitation from a club member was required to join.

In 1977, membership in the group (now called NDSU Women's Club) was opened to all university-related personnel, including graduate students.

Currently, no direct connection to NDSU is required.

NDSU Women's Club Hosts Seasonal Club-wide Events

Three seasonal events for the entire membership and guests of NDSU Women's Club are held in Fall, Winter, and Spring.

Special programming at these events in recent years has included:

- A conversation with NDSU President Dr. Dean Bresciani,
- ♦ Diva Dance evening with Chris Linnares,
- ♦ A Powerpoint talk by the President of the Northern Plains Botanic Society,
- Fashions of the prairie through the decades, and other speakers of regional renown.
