Dr. Gordon received her Ph.D. in clinical psychology at Florida State University and is currently an assistant professor at NDSU. Her research program centers around two major public health problems: disordered eating and suicidal behavior. Her most recent research focuses on disordered eating among traditionally understudied groups (e.g., ethnic minority individuals, males), interpersonal and emotional processes related to suicidal behavior and disordered eating, and the occurrence of suicidal behavior among individuals with eating disorders. Her publications include articles in *Body Image*, *Sex Roles*, and *Eating Behaviors*, among others.
