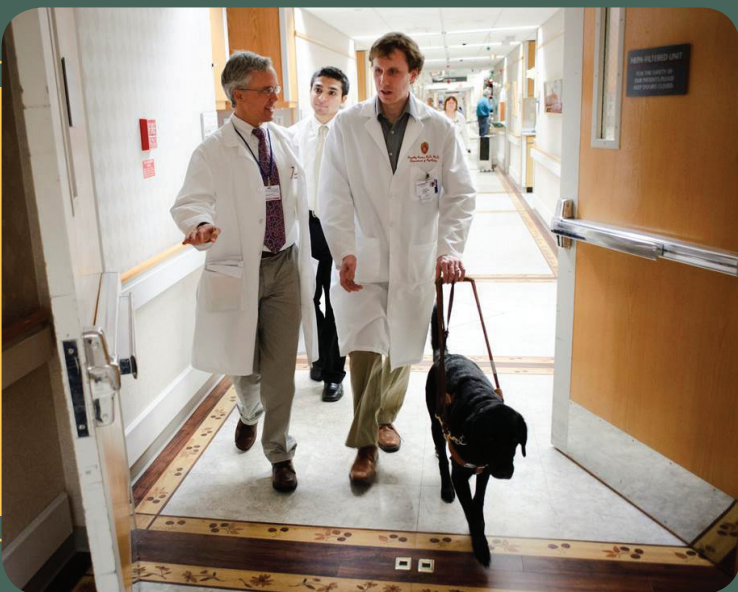

Dr. Tim Cordes earned a doctorate in biomolecular chemistry and a doctor of medicine from the University of Wisconsin – Madison. He is believed to be the only blind person ever to obtain these dual degrees.

Cordes will share transformational insights about his personal journey. His message concentrates on perceptions of ability and disability, and his examples demonstrate how open minds and innovation can identify both barriers and solutions.
