# Korean Adoption Histories in the Public Eye: American Newspaper Coverage of Korean Adoption from 1952-Present

#### Tuesday, April 29

#### Noon-1pm, MU Century Theater

Dr. Kim Park Nelson, Associate Professor of American Multicultural Studies, Minnesota State University Moorhead. This presentation is an analysis of print news coverage of Korean adoptees in Seattle, Washington, Portland, Oregon, and Minneapolis-St. Paul, Minnesota. Throughout Korean adoption history, news coverage shows how American public perceptions of Korean adoption have changed over its history: a practice that was closely associated with the American military in the beginning gave way to human interest stories designed for women by the 1960s, then to stories of idealized multicultural "rainbow" families in the 1970s and 1980s, then to stories of adoptees themselves in the 1990s, and consumerist "buyer beware" stories in the 2000s. This presentation will trace this journalistic history and reflect on its significance within Korean adoption history.
