Transportation Scholarships

1. The Charles E. Herman Scholarship recognizes academic achievement and promotes the education of transportation students with a preference to women and minorities at NDSU. Funding for one \$2,000 scholarship is provided by the Charles E. Herman Scholarship Endowment Fund, NDSU Development Foundation.
2. The Paul E.R. Abrahamson Transportation Scholarship recognizes outstanding students at NDSU with an interest in the transportation and logistics of agricultural products. Funding for two \$1,500 scholarships is provided by the MPC through the University Transportation Centers Program of the U.S. Department of Transportation.
3. The Transportation Engineering Scholarship recognizes academic achievement and promotes the education of transportation students at NDSU. Funding for two \$1,500 scholarships is provided by the MPC through the University Transportation Centers Program of the U.S. Department of Transportation.



The UW Environmental Health Research Experience Program

The UW Environmental Health Research Experience Program (EHREP) is a funded, nine-week summer experience for undergraduates with an interest in environmental health sciences. EHREP provides students with hands on experience in laboratories of leading researchers, introduces them to key environmental and occupational health issues while offering research exposure that will help them become competitive for graduate school. Students will work full-time under the supervision of a faculty mentor and will receive a stipend of \$5,200.

One of the goals of this program is to increase and diversify the pool of future applicants for graduate study in this field, leading to more outstanding scientists selecting Environmental Health Sciences as a career focus. We strongly encourage students who are underrepresented in the sciences to apply.

Office of Multicultural Programs Scholarships

1.) About the Judge Myron Bright Diversity Leadership Student Scholarship Fund

This scholarship fund was established by Judge Myron Bright to assist with the costs of achieving a college education for multicultural students at North Dakota State University. Maintained at the NDSU Alumni Foundation, the scholarship fund receives additional donations from faculty, staff and alumni. The fund recognizes students' leadership roles within the university and to the multicultural student community. Award amounts are \$500.

Eligibility

- Enrolled at North Dakota State University during the full 2014-2015 academic year
- Must have completed at least one (1) semester at NDSU
- Student identifies as multicultural and/or leadership or service in the multicultural community
- Satisfactory academic progress
- Preference will be given to those applicants who have not already received this scholarship

Applications sought from persons of diverse backgrounds, particularly those from traditionally underrepresented communities and demographic groups.

Award Terms

- To be applied to tuition, books, and/or fees through Financial Aid
- Valid only for the 2014-2015 academic year
- Award will be reported to the Financial Aid as a scholarship

2.) About the Celebrating Diversity Scholarship

This scholarship was developed in 2013 to honor one student each year who exemplifies strong leadership and commitment to academic success here at NDSU. Maintained at the NDSU Alumni Foundation, the scholarship fund receives additional donations from faculty, staff and alumni. The fund recognizes students' leadership and academic success within the university. Award amount is \$500.

Eligibility

- Enrolled at North Dakota State University during the full 2014-2015 academic year
- Must have completed at least one (1) semester at NDSU
- Student identifies as multicultural and/or leadership or service in the multicultural community
- Satisfactory academic progress

- Preference will be given to those applicants who have not already received this scholarship
- Applications sought from persons of diverse backgrounds, particularly those from traditionally underrepresented communities and demographic groups.

3.) About the Ram Lal Juahar Memorial Student Scholarship Fund

- Must have completed at least one (1) semester at NDSU
- Student identifies as multicultural and/or leadership or service in the multicultural community
- Satisfactory academic progress
- Preference will be given to those applicants who have not already received this scholarship
- Applications sought from persons of diverse backgrounds, particularly those from traditionally underrepresented communities and demographic groups.
