# A Message from the Dean

A MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

Welcome back students! It is always nice to see the students filling the hallways and classrooms of Sudro Hall after the summer break. I hope you all had an enjoyable and fun summer. The 2013-2014 academic year will be another busy year for our College with several changes that will impact students. First, we have implemented a new iPad requirement for students to promote the latest advances in instructional technology to enhance student learning in both the classroom and on clinical rotations. Students will be able to access instructors notes, handouts, slides, and any required reading materials at any time using their mobile device. In addition, students will no longer need to purchase (or carry in their backpacks) many textbooks required for class because

textbooks and other instructional resources will now be accessible to students for free via their iPad mobile device through Access Pharmacy®, an online library resource for students and faculty. In addition, in the 4<sup>th</sup> professional year during clinical rotations, students will have ready and convenient access to online resources to immediately answer questions from physicians, nurses, and patients regarding the patient's health condition and/or medications. There will no longer be the need for students to run to the library to look up answers to these important clinical questions concerning patients. Everything quick, convenient, and immediately accessible at your fingertips at all times. The iPad will also make learning more enjoyable and fun for students. We hope you think so too.

Second, the Sudro Hall Health Sciences Library will be moving in December to allow our College to address some critical space shortage needs. We are working closely with the Library to ensure that students, faculty, and staff will have access to the necessary resources to support our academic and research missions. We ask that students be patient during this space transition period.

Lastly, we worked with an architect this summer to update our long-term space plans for the College to address some urgent program accreditation concerns regarding space. The results of this effort produced plans for an exciting new 85,000 sq. ft. building addition to Sudro Hall which will contain additional office space, conference rooms, instructional laboratory space, research laboratory space, a new student lounge, and new Health Sciences Library. We are hoping that the University will submit this new building addition as a capital priority for the next legislative session.

I hope that you all have a healthy, fun, and productive school year. Don't hesitate to stop by my office to say hi if you have the time. cdp

# NDSHP (North Dakota Society of Health System Pharmacists)

NDSU's NDSHP student society is a group of professional pharmacy, as well as prepharmacy, students who are interested in a career in the health-system aspect of pharmacy including: hospitals, long-term care facilities, ambulatory care settings, clinics, home health care settings and more! Essentially, we look at everything other than the retail side of the pharmacy world. The organization is one of more than 100 ASHP (American Society of Health System Pharmacists) officially recognized student societies.

We strive to provide interested students with information to help them learn and become involved, with a large focus on pharmacy residencies. These structured, directed, salaried, postgraduate training programs, which focus on a defined area of pharmacy practice, are becoming more and more competitive and encouraged throughout health-systems. They typically last one year (PGY1) but further specialization with subsequent residency years is a widely growing option! Our organization is here to help students learn about the benefits and opportunities available to them when it comes to doing a pharmacy residency.

Throughout the rest of the year we will be hosting several speakers, including practicing pharmacists who have completed residencies (both PGY1 and PGY2), fellowships and those who are involved with different health-system settings.
