Rhonda thanked everyone for participation in the Blood Drive on December 4th and 5th. Rhonda received a letter from Pat Cossette saying that the Fall of 2002 was the largest Blood Drive at NDSU since 1997. During the two day drive they interviewed 56 people and were able to collect 41 units of blood. Eighteen of the 41 pints that were donated were first time donors. They have been distributed to 43 various hospitals and estimate they will help about 123 people over the holidays.

Nancy Mueller and Rhonda Kitch are in the process of awarding a number of Kampus Kudo awards.

5. University Senate Committees:

Campus Space & Facilities: (Mike Tracy)

The next meeting will be sometime in January. They are talking about raising the parking fees to help resurface the parking lots. They have a lot of different proposals. They have had four open forums in the last couple of weeks. Seventeen people attended the open forums. There was also some discussion on payroll deduction. Some of it was positive and there were a few that didn't like it.
