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Meeting called to order: President Pam Hommen called the meeting to order, and everyone was welcomed.

Membership: (Cindy Kozojed) Everyone was reminded to please check in on the sheets at the back table. Three new members were introduced today who have been appointed to finish terms of others, they were: Linda Hoiland, Kristie Feist and Nancy Lilleberg. Updated committee lists were distributed. The new trifold directory will be sent to everyone soon.

PROGRAM: President Joseph Chapman. President Chapman spoke of the exciting times for NDSU and ran through some of the things that are taking place on campus. NDSU is seeing an incredible growth in enrollment – the projection is to be over 11,600 this year. Graduate programs are on track and likely to be over 1400 grad students this year (this includes doctoral students). Campus research expenditures will be over 90 million dollars this year – this is tremendous growth from just three years ago. President Chapman thanked the staff for their part in growing the University. He spoke of the large amount of construction on campus now, and what will be starting in the next two years. The older buildings will continue to be updated in order to keep them in line with the new construction. He commended the grounds crew on the wonderful look of the campus this summer. The corner of 12th Avenue and 18th Street will be made into a Botanical Garden area – groundbreaking to take place over Homecoming week. The entrance to Albrecht Boulevard will have a major piece of art and groundbreaking for that will also be over Homecoming week. Six major dedications/groundbreakings will take place this year during Homecoming week. The President spoke of Alien Technologies coming to the Research Park. Their building will be 118,000 square feet (about 2/3 of the FargoDome). They anticipate having 1100 employees at this facility, which will have a major impact for NDSU and the community. President Chapman impressed on the Staff Senate the incredibly positive impact they have on visitors to campus. He assured the senate that the \$1000 Professional Development Grant and the tuition waiver will not go away. The President then took questions from the members, after which he excused himself from the meeting.

2. Review and approval of the Staff Senate Minutes from June 10, 2003:

Teresa Sonsthagen moved the minutes from the June 10, 2003 staff senate meeting be approved, with the addition of the scholarship year-end report. **Carolyn Beckerleg seconded** the motion. All in favor, **motion carried**.
