After that, he moved to Idaho and worked as a radio news director, newspaper reporter, photographer, editor, public information specialist for the state of Idaho, real estate salesperson, and homebuilder. Throughout most of that time he did freelance photography and writing as a sideline.

As a member of NDSU Staff Senate, Paul has served on the public relations committee for four and a half years as a photographer, writer, and editor for The Messenger newsletter, and committee co-chair in 2005-2006.

"Discover U" is designed to give staff members opportunities to discover new things about themselves, their jobs, and others with whom they interact. This year's workshop

included a keynote presentation and the opportunity to participate in three of nine different concurrent break-out sessions.

The workshop was off to a good start with a welcome from Steve Bergeson, Staff Senate President, and NDSU President Chapman. Staci Pauer and Denise Hellekson from the Village Business Institute of Fargo provided an enlightening presentation about *Generations in the Workplace*.

Participants learned how to recognize the four generations now working together and effective strategies for dealing with differences.

Break-out sessions included: Dealing with Difficult Personalities, Effective Listening, Serving the Difficult Customer, Building A More Confident U, Managing Time and Managing Stress, and Assertiveness and the Stress Response. Other sessions offered useful tips on Exercise Anywhere, Anytime and Organizing Your Work Nest.

A special treat during the noon lunch break was the session *Daily Mindfulness and the 3-Minute Meditation* by Ronni Arensburg from NDSU Counseling and Disability Services. She began by discussing the importance of taking time out to regroup and center ourselves during our busy days. She then led everyone through a three-minute breathing space meditation.

Other NDSU presenters included: Brent Parmer and Tara Roberts from the Wellness Center, Michelle Richter from Counseling and Disability Services, and Dr. Prakash Mathew, Vice President for Student Affairs, who gave the closing remarks.
