

The Department of Psychology at North Dakota State University offers doctoral and master's programs in psychology.

Our students have ample opportunity to work closely with faculty members who are experts in their fields. Students will receive a solid foundation of instruction in their chosen areas of study as well as numerous opportunities for research.

Our research facilities include the Center for Visual Neuroscience, initially funded by an NIH Center for Biomedical Research Excellence grant. This center includes:

- State-of-the-art EEG laboratories to conduct electrical brain-imaging experiments;
- An advanced driving simulator laboratory;
- A virtual reality laboratory, which includes the best head-mount display currently on the market.

Researchers in the CVN have produced groundbreaking studies on the neural mechanisms underlying sensory processes.

PSYCHOLOGY

PH.D. PROGRAMS

Our doctoral programs include two tracks of study:

- Health/social psychology
- Visual/cognitive neuroscience

These programs are designed to produce graduates with strong research skills who will be competitive in the academic job market as well as in public and private research settings.

Our programs are based on a mentorship model in which students work closely with faculty members. In addition to core course work, students receive:

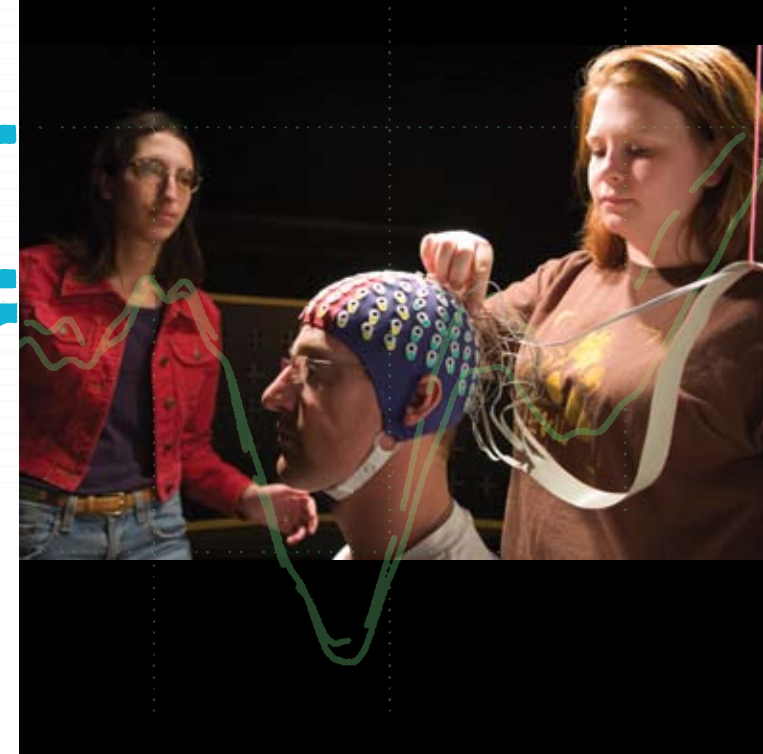
- Training in research methods and statistics
- Laboratory experience in an apprenticeship model of research training (Our entire faculty is active in research and publication.)
- Teacher training, which culminates in the students' preparation and teaching of their own courses

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The department supports its Ph.D. students through teaching or research assistantships.

Half-time assistantships: \$12,000/year for nine-month academic year, accompanied by tuition and fee waivers. Summer funding is often available.

Special fellowships: \$16,000/year stipends available on a competitive basis.



MASTER'S PROGRAM

The clinical master's program is rigorous and empirically oriented. Research involvement and completion of course work in core disciplines provide excellent preparation for continuing in a doctoral program.

Clinical course work and practicum provide the ideal preparation for those who wish to work in an applied setting. Our behavior therapy orientation stresses integrating the concepts and procedures of the researcher with the interpersonal skills of the therapist. An emphasis is placed on the clear specification of problems, treatments and results.

Experience and training are available in:

- Behavioral medicine/health psychology
- Cognitive behavior therapy

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Students in the master's program are supported by quarter-time research or teaching assistantships.
