***The Global Perspectives and Cultural Diversity requirements can be fulfilled within other general education categories. Check with an advisor for courses that meet this requirement.

A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.80 in college course work is required for evaluation for admission to the nursing program.

Actual admission "cut off" is generally much higher.

Applications for admission to the nursing program must be made by October 1 for the class beginning in the spring semester of the sophomore year.

The admission committee will evaluate applicants based on selective GPA, completion of prerequisite courses with a grade of C or better, eligibility for sophomore standing and personal references. Preference is given to ND residents and students who have taken a greater number of credits in the ND University System. A personal visit, which may include an impromptu essay written during the visit, may be part of the evaluation process.
