## By Sat. the 31st

- Browse around our Blackboard to get familiar with it.
- Read our Homepage. This is at the top of the Bb menu, and contains a ton of info about the course: the course description, aims, primary course work, grading scheme, policies, textbooks, and so on.

#### Writing Down the Bones:

- "Introduction," pp. 1-4.
- "Beginner's Mind, Pen, and Paper," pp. 5-7.
- "First Thoughts," pp. 8-10.
- Note that the author refers to journals as "notebooks."

Imaginative Writing:

- Chap. 1, "Invitation to the Writer," pp. 1-12, with special attention to "...and your journal," pp. 6-12.
- Write a journal response to the readings. (Occasionally I will give you assigned journal exercises.) Make this at least a couple, very well developed paragraphs, and simply respond in a thoughtful way to the material: comment on what seems interesting, fun, srange, or difficult; ask questions about the material; talk to the writer in an imaginary scene; use something in the reading to brainstorm a list of ideas for things you'd like to write this term.
- Complete the third part of CONVO #1, due by Wed. 11:59 pm.
