

Not required to be groomed or bathed. Attendees are also responsible for watering their animal(s) and bringing applicable supplies you might need for showmanship and obedience. | For Showmanship practice and Fair —A leather or nylon adjustable slip leash/collar to use as a single piece or a two-piece set. As a two-piece set the collar portion can be chain, cord or leather. For Obedience practice and show - a 6ft leash is standard equipment for any obedience work, pleasure hikes and general dog handling in public. A slip chain or slip collar should be used in conjunction with the 6ft leash. | | | |
