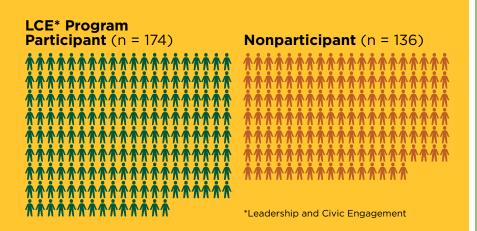
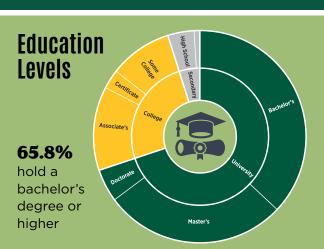

#### DRIVING SKILL DEVELOPMENT

By Gaining Practical Tools and Using Them

## What This Means for My Community

Participants leave with stronger leadership, communication, and problem-solving skills. They have the tools that equip them to take action.

Participants outperformed nonparticipants in four
key skill areas: problem solving, creating change,
communication and decision-making.

Participants were **2.6x more likely** to adopt new leadership or community practices.

**More LCE programming** meant more crediting the experience with developing participants' leadership skills.



# FUELING COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

With Increased Participant Confidence

## What This Means for My Community

Trained individuals are more likely to join boards, organize projects and step into decision-making roles.

Participants are **1.83x more likely** to participate in community partnerships.

Participants experienced a **20% increase per program dose** in feeling empowered to run for office.

Participants are **2.2x more likely** to hold leadership roles.

Rural participants were **4x more likely** to engage in leadership roles than those from towns with populations of 2,500-24,999.

Rural participants were **3.4x more likely** to engage in policy development than those from towns with populations of 2,500-24,999.



# ACCELERATING COMMUNITY PLANNING

By Turning Learning Into Action

## What This Means for My Community

Engaged participants move from conversation to action by getting involved in community planning and strategy. Participants are **1.98x more likely** to be involved in community planning.

Participants experienced a **13% increase per program dose** in the likelihood of being involved in community planning.



# AMPLIFYING COMMUNITY IMPACT

With Stronger Voices and Greater Changes

## What This Means for My Community

Participants who take part in more LCE programming report greater confidence in creating local change.

<b>28% of participants</b> were involved in community a	ınc
organizational policy efforts.	

Participants felt they made a **bigger difference** in their communities.

The more LCE activities participants took part in, the more they felt they were **making a difference** in their communities.
