### Ag and Natural Resources: Issues and Education

**Logan County Weed Board Fall Cost Share Program:** 19 Logan County landowners submitted cost share applications for their control efforts of noxious weeds to the Logan County Weed Board. ~\$17,000 was paid back to those landowners to cover herbicide related expenses.

**Logan County Livestock & Grain Assoc.:** Logan County Livestock & Grain Assoc. board met in December to review yearly activities and discuss the current state of our county seed increase program. Currently, only 1 Logan County farmer participates in the program. The board will offer one \$500 scholarship opportunities to 2026 Logan County High School graduates.

**Logan County NDAWN Station:** Logan County finally received its very own NDAWN weather station this fall. The weather station is located about 1 mile south of the Hwy 34/Hwy 30 intersection. While there are other weather stations that can provide useful weather data on the borders of the county, this station is the 1 and only within our borders. It is supplied with a camera, snow depth stake, and other weather monitoring devices that are updated every few minutes. Local producers have expressed great appreciation for this project.

## North Dakota Extension Disaster Education Network—ND-EDEN

## Kids. Compost, Crops, & Consumption (KC3) Program

**Fall 2025—Napoleon School 3rd & 4th Grade classes:** The KC3 program is designed to teach 3rd & 4th grade students about the food cycle through 5– 6 weekly lessons. The program begins with livestock as the foundation of the food cycle and ends ultimately with a lesson on consumption. Other topics covered in the program include: Composting/manure, Basic Soil Health principles, Crops & other food plants. A post survey done with the kids indicated there was a significant interest in **compost**. (Who knew!?) Both classroom teachers were great to work with and indicated they would like to continue the program in years to come. A total of 36 kids took part in the program.
