

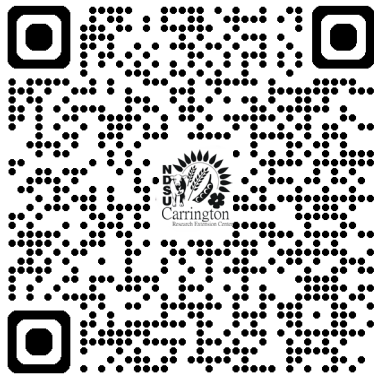
## Audience
