North Dakota State University Counselor Education Program/Student Outcomes Report September 2018

Number of program graduates from the past year (2017-18)

During the 2017-18 academic year, 15 master's degree students graduated (10 graduates in the clinical mental health program and 5 graduates in the school counseling program). In the previous academic year, 18 master's degree students graduated.

During the 2017-18 academic year, 2 Ph.D. students graduated. In the previous academic year, 2 Ph.D. students graduated.

Completion rate

Regarding the completion rate of the master's degree students who graduated in 2018, 100% of the students completed their program within the expected time period.

Regarding the completion rate of the Ph.D. students who graduated in 2018, the average completion rate was 3.5 years.

Job placement rate

Master's graduates from 2017-18 who were seeking full-time employment have a 100 % job placement rate (for both Clinical Mental Health Counseling and School Counseling tracks).

2017-18 Counselor Education and Supervision Ph.D. graduates had a 100% job placement rate.

Licensure or certification examination pass rate

During the 2017-18 academic year, NDSU Counselor Education students had a 100% pass rate.

School counseling program graduates who seek to become credentialed in North Dakota are not required to pass the NCE. However, school counseling graduate students who have taken the Praxis I exam and the Praxis II: Professional School Counselor exam had a 100 % pass rate.

Our students have consistently done very well on the Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE). During the 2017-18 academic year, 100 % of our students passed the CPCE exam. NDSU's mean scores in all eight (8) content areas were above the national mean score.
