- Both the city of Harvey and Wells County experienced a modest decline in population between 1990 and 2000.
- Population projections for Wells County indicate that population declines are likely to continue over the next two decades.
- The city of Harvey and Wells County experienced a decline in the proportion of youth under 20 years of age and an increase in the proportion of elderly ages 65 and older between 1990 and 2000. Projections for Wells County indicate that these trends will likely continue for the next couple decades.
- There was little change in the racial diversity of Harvey and Wells County between 1990 and 2000; nearly all residents were white in 2000.

- While the city of Harvey experienced little change in the total number of housing units between 1990 and 2000, Wells County experienced a decline in housing. In 2000, 64 percent of housing units in Wells County and 61 percent in Harvey were owner-occupied.
- The number of vacant housing units increased in the city of Harvey and declined slightly in Wells County between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, vacant housing comprised 12 percent of all housing in Harvey and 16 percent in Wells County.
- In 2000, the median value of an owner-occupied home in the city of Harvey was \$52,200, compared to \$38,700 in Wells County.
- In 2000, half of all housing units in the city of Harvey were built before 1966; half of all housing units in Wells County were built before 1960.

- The median household income in the city of Harvey was \$33,017 in 2000, compared to \$31,894 in Wells County. When the 1990 median values are adjusted for inflation, the 2000 median household incomes represent an increase in purchasing power for the city of Harvey and Wells County.
- While the proportion of residents living below poverty remained relatively unchanged in the city of Harvey between 1990 and 2000, the proportion of impoverished residents declined in Wells County. In 2000, 12 percent of residents in Harvey and 14 percent in Wells County were impoverished.
- The number of impoverished children declined in both the city of Harvey and Wells County between 1990 and 2000. At the same time, the number of impoverished elderly increased slightly in Harvey and declined in Wells County. In 2000, children comprised 19 percent of all impoverished residents in Wells County and 14 percent in Harvey. Elderly comprised 33 percent of all impoverished residents in Wells County and 59 percent in Harvey in 2000.

- The number of reported deaths in Wells County totaled 52 in 2005, down from 79 in 2003. Major contributors to death were heart disease and cancer.
- In 2005, the number of foster care placements in Wells County was seven, down from 16 in 2002.

- The percentage of employment that was female increased between 1990 to 2000 for both the city of Harvey and Wells County. In 2000, females comprised 49 percent of all employed in the city of Harvey and 46 percent in Wells County.
- In both the city of Harvey and Wells County, service industry employment increased between 1990 and 2000 and agricultural and retail trade employment declined. In 2000, the service sector was the largest industry in both areas, employing 51 percent of all workers in Harvey and 41 percent in Wells County.

- In 2004-2005, 77 percent of students in the Harvey Public School District were proficient or advanced in reading, up from 69 percent in 2001-2002. In addition, 67 percent of students were proficient or advanced in math in 2004-2005, up from 43 percent in 2001-2002.
