- The total population in Red Lake Falls has increased modestly over the past decade even though the overall county population has declined slightly.
- Future projections indicate that the Red Lake County population will remain relatively stable, thus Red Lake Falls is likely to grow modestly over time.
- Nearly 22 percent of the residents in Red Lake Falls city are at least 65 years of age. This proportion has
  increased slightly since 1990. Nonetheless, the elderly projections for the county indicate that the
  proportion of seniors in Red Lake Falls city will grow over time.
- The racial mix of residents in Red Lake Falls city and Red Lake County remain predominately white. Little
  change in the overall diversity of the area occurred over the past decade with the exception of a marked
  increase in Native Americans.

- Income levels for Red Lake Falls city are lower than those in Red Lake County. The median household income in Red Lake Falls in 2000 was \$30,536 relative to \$32,052 in Red Lake County.
- The proportion of Red Lake Falls city residents in poverty has declined from 16.8 percent in 1990 to 11.4
  percent in 2000.
- The number and proportion of children impoverished in Red Lake Falls city has been cut nearly in half since 1990, dropping from 20.6 percent in 1990 to 11.8 percent in 2000. A similar but less dramatic decline in elderly poor also occurred during the same time period.
