- Both the city of Stanley and Mountrail County experienced a decline in population between 1990 and 2000.
- Population projections for Mountrail County indicate that slight declines in population are likely to continue over the next two decades.
- The city of Stanley experienced a decline in the proportion of residents under 20 years of age and an increase in the proportion of residents ages 65 and older between 1990 and 2000, while Mountrail County experienced a decline in both age groups. Projections for Mountrail County indicate that the decline in the proportion of youth will continue over the next two decades; however, the elderly are projected to increase.
- While nearly all the residents in the city of Stanley were white in 2000, 30 percent of Mountrail County residents were American Indian or Alaska Native, up from 20 percent in 1990.

- Both the city of Stanley and Mountrail County experienced declines in the total number of housing units between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, 54 percent of housing units in Mountrail County and 64 percent in Stanley were owner-occupied.
- Both the city of Stanley and Mountrail County experienced declines in the total number of vacant housing units between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, vacant housing comprised 14 percent of all housing in Stanley and 26 percent in Mountrail County.
- In 2000, the median value of an owner-occupied home in the city of Stanley was \$35,200, compared to \$39,700 in Mountrail County. These 2000 values were actually lower than their 1990 values after adjusting for inflation.
- In 2000, half of all housing units in the city of Stanley were built before 1957; half of all housing units in Mountrail County were built before 1968.

- The median household income in the city of Stanley was \$23,993 in 2000, compared to \$27,098 in Mountrail County. When the 1990 median values are adjusted for inflation, the 2000 median household incomes represent a decline in purchasing power for the city of Stanley and an increase in purchasing power for Mountrail County.
- The city of Stanley and Mountrail County experienced a decline in the number and proportion of persons living below poverty between 1990 and 2000. Nonetheless, 19 percent of residents in Mountrail County and 11 percent in Stanley were impoverished in 2000.
- The number of impoverished children declined in both Stanley and Mountrail County between 1990 and 2000. At the same time, the number of impoverished elderly declined slightly in Stanley and remained relatively unchanged in Mountrail County. In 2000, children comprised 35 percent of all impoverished residents in Mountrail County and 28 percent in Stanley. Elderly comprised 15 percent of all impoverished residents in Mountrail County and 36 percent in Stanley in 2000.

- Mountrail County reported 88 births in 2005, a rate of 13.27 per 1,000 persons. This rate was down from 17.64 in 2004.
- Mountrail County reported 77 deaths in 2005, down from 107 in 2003. Major contributors to death were heart disease and cancer.
- The number of foster care placements decreased in Mountrail County over the last three years. In 2005, there were 15 placements, down from 26 in 2003.

- Total employment was relatively unchanged between 1990 and 2000 in both the city of Stanley and Mountrail County.
- The gender distribution in employment remained relatively stable in the city of Stanley between 1990 and 2000; females comprised 50 percent of employment in 2000. In Mountrail County, the gender distribution changed slightly. In 2000, females comprised 48 percent of all employed, up from 45 percent in 1990.
- Both the city of Stanley and Mountrail County experienced a decline in retail trade employment between 1990 and 2000 and an increase in service industry employment. Additionally, Mountrail County saw declines in manufacturing and agriculture, forestry, and mining employment. In 2000, the service sector was the largest industry in both areas, employing 42 percent of workers in Mountrail County and 48 percent in Stanley.

- Enrollment within the Stanley Public School District declined over the past few years. K-12 enrollment totaled 340 students in 2004-2005, down from 406 in 2001-2002.
- In 2004-2005, 79 percent of students in the Stanley Public School District were proficient or advanced in reading, up from 77 percent in 2001-2002. In addition, 72 percent of students were proficient or advanced in math in 2004-2005, up from 52 percent in 2001-2002.
