- The boundaries for zip code 58067 changed significantly between 1990 and 2000 (see boundary maps). Therefore, an assessment of change between 1990 and 2000 using these data is not appropriate.
- In 1990, zip code 58067 encompassed most of the southeast corner of Sargent County with 1,130 residents. A boundary change in 2000 reduced the territory to an area from Rutland to Cayuga which had only 337 residents.
- Sargent County experienced a modest decline in population between 1990 and 2000. Population projections for Sargent County indicate that population declines are likely to continue over the next two decades.
- In 2000, 31 percent of the residents in zip code 58067 and 28 percent in Sargent County were youth under 20 years of age. In addition, the proportion of elderly ages 65 and older represented 17 percent of the total population in both areas. Sargent County experienced a decline in the proportion of youth and relatively little change in the proportion of elderly between 1990 and 2000. Projections for Sargent County indicate that this loss of youth will likely continue over the next couple decades; however, the proportion of elderly is expected to increase.
- In 2000, nearly all residents in both zip code 58067 and Sargent County were white.

- The boundaries for zip code 58067 changed significantly between 1990 and 2000 (see boundary maps). Therefore, an assessment of change between 1990 and 2000 using these data is not appropriate.
- Sargent County experienced a slight decline in the total number of housing units between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, 71 percent of housing in Sargent County and 80 percent in zip code 58067 was owner-occupied.
- Vacant housing units declined in Sargent County between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, vacant units represented 11 percent of all housing in Sargent County and 9 percent of housing in zip code 58067.
- In 2000, the median value of an owner-occupied home in zip code 58067 was \$20,800, compared to \$44,800 in Sargent County. This may reflect the relatively older housing that exists in zip code 58067 compared to Sargent county.
- In 2000, half of all housing units in zip code 58067 were built before 1949; half of all housing units in Sargent County were built before 1962.

- The boundaries for zip code 58067 changed significantly between 1990 and 2000 (see boundary maps). Therefore, an assessment of change between 1990 and 2000 using these data is not appropriate.
- The median household income in zip code 58067 was \$30,455 in 2000, compared to \$37,213 in Sargent County. When the 1990 median values are adjusted for inflation, the 2000 median household income represents an increase in purchasing power for Sargent County residents.
- The proportion of residents living below poverty declined in Sargent County between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, 8 percent of residents in Sargent County and 18 percent of residents in zip code 58067 were impoverished.
- Between 1990 and 2000, the number of both impoverished children and impoverished elderly declined in Sargent County. In 2000, children comprised 29 percent of impoverished residents in Sargent County and 40 percent in zip code 58067. The elderly comprised 24 percent of impoverished residents in Sargent County and 31 percent in zip code 58067 in 2000.

- The number of churches, synagogues, mosques, and temples in Sargent County declined by three between 1990 and 2000 and the number of full-time members declined as well. These declines may be a reflection of the overall population loss the county experienced during the same time period.

- Sargent County reported 48 births in 2005, a rate of 10.99 per 1,000 persons. Over the past few years, this rate increased consistently, up from 8.25 in 2002.
- The number of deaths occurring in Sargent County has fluctuated over the past few years, totaling 38 in 2005. Major contributors to death were heart disease and cancer.
- In 2005, there were 12 foster care placements in Sargent County, little change from the previous few years.

- The boundaries for zip code 58067 changed significantly between 1990 and 2000 (see boundary maps). Therefore, an assessment of change between 1990 and 2000 using these data is not appropriate.
- The labor force experienced a slight increase in Sargent County between 1990 and 2000, despite a decline in the number of persons 16 years and older.
- In 2000, the unemployment rate was 1.9 percent in Sargent County and 1.1 percent in zip code 58067.

- The boundaries for zip code 58067 changed significantly between 1990 and 2000 (see boundary maps). Therefore, an assessment of change between 1990 and 2000 using these data is not appropriate.
- Total employment increased in Sargent County between 1990 and 2000.
- The percentage of employment that was female increased in Sargent County between 1990 and 2000. In 2000, females comprised 45 percent of all employed in zip code 58067 and 42 percent of all employed in Sargent County.
- Sargent County experienced declines in the proportion of agricultural and retail trade employment between 1990 and 2000 and experienced growth in the proportion of manufacturing and service industry employment. In 2000, the service sector was the largest industry in zip code 58067 employing 29 percent of all workers, just slightly more than the manufacturing industry which employed 24 percent of the workforce in 2000. In Sargent County, manufacturing was the largest industry in 2000 employing 31 percent of all workers, just slightly more than the service industry which employed 26 percent of the workforce.

- The proportion of persons ages 25 and older with a college degree and the proportion with some college but no degree increased between 1990 and 2000 in Sargent County. In 2000, 25 percent of the residents ages 25 and older in zip code 58067 and 22 percent county-wide had a college degree.

- Enrollment within the Sargent Central Public School District declined over the past few years, from 334 students in 2001-2002 to 303 students in 2004-2005.
- In 2004-2005, 76 percent of students in the Sargent Central Public School District were proficient or advanced in reading, up from 64 percent in 2001-2002. In addition, 70 percent of students were proficient or advanced in math in 2004-2005, up from 46 percent in 2001-2002.
