

Based on the number of people who attended these events and the feedback board members received afterwards, they were a big success.

None of this could have happened without our hard-working board members and volunteers. I'd like to offer a special thanks to all of them for hanging in there and being willing to try some new things, with the goal of keeping the Club energized and viable into the future.

I'd also like to thank all of you who have paid your membership dues this year. I realize that economic times are tough and that hard choices sometimes have to be made about where to spend each dollar. The board recognizes this, and has chosen not to cut anyone off from communication about Club events and activities, regardless of whether or not dues were paid.

You should know that the executive board is very frugal with your dues. We hold costs down so that as many dollars as possible can be allocated for scholarships. Although it may at first sound frivolous to hold our Spring Brunch at the Radisson, the cost came in lower than venues at other hotels, event centers or on the NDSU campus, since we now must pay to use its facilities. We are lucky that a previous board had the foresight to raise dues to their current level. This should enable us to cover increased operating expenses in the future.

The Club will award two \$1000 scholarships to NDSU women who will be juniors next year. Please help us spread the word. Half of your membership dues this year, \$1165, have been set aside for those scholarships. We received additional scholarship donations amounting to \$195, for a total of \$1360. The remaining \$640 will come from the Club's savings account. Again, we are lucky that the Club has a reserve in savings that allows us to do this. Our membership currently is 119—room to grow!

I have enjoyed getting to know more of you this year, finding out more about the history of the Club, hearing your ideas of things you'd like the Club to do and be in the future and having the opportunity to make some of those ideas a reality. And I look forward to continuing on as ex-officio next year as a strong supporter of the Club and its mission.

NDSU Women's Club Scholarships

Two \$1000 scholarships will be awarded for use beginning in the fall semester 2011 for female NDSU students . To be eligible a student must:

- 1. Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.2 or above at the end of 2010 fall semester;
 - 2. Be from North Dakota, South Dakota or Minnesota;
- 3. Have attained junior status entering the upcoming fall semester, regardless of age;
- 4. Provide evidence of extra-curricular and/or community involvement; and
- 5. Provide letters of reference from at least two NDSU-related persons, one of whom is the major professor.

Applications may be obtained at the NDSU Office of Student Financial Services. Completed applications must be submitted to Bison Connection by May 3, 2011.
