Campus Connection Access

New staff can join us at any point of the year, but it always seems that the beginning of fall semester has more employees waiting for Campus Connection access than other times throughout the year. To ensure that access to Campus Connection is set up as quickly and accurately as possible, please review the process below:

To obtain Campus Connection Security access, an employee must first claim their Connect ND user name and password. Once the user name and password have been claimed, Data Privacy training can be completed online. Once completed, users can fill out a Security Access Request form for either Academic Staff, Non-Academic Staff or Professional Advisors depending on their position.

It is important that the Data Privacy training is completed

prior to submitting the Security Access Request form, as ConnectND will not process security requests until the Data Privacy training has been completed. Security Access Request forms should be faxed to the Office of Registration and Records number listed on the form, as it is the fastest way to receive/process the form. 
