



## 5 QUICK TAKE-AWAYS FOR PROMOTING ENGAGEMENT

## #1 Communicating Clearly: Starting the Semester

- Get to know your learners
  - Interest Survey in Qualtrics
  - Name Cards
- Help learners get to know you
- Ensure learners know how to navigate your class and access materials
  - How Blackboard is organized
  - How to contact you
  - When and how feedback will be delivered and grades posted
  - How to get help and from whom
- Keep notes on what went well and what didn't
- Remember OTL is here to help

## Name Cards



- Fold like a name tent
- Can hang off front of desk/table
- Identify 3 things to share (What would you be doing if it was your day off? What's your favorite food? How many siblings do you have?)
- Set a norm to use them every class period so you and others know everyone's names

Variations: Flip, Discussion Board, Padlet



## #2 Communicating Clearly: Rules

As you develop classroom rules, keep in mind the potential positive and negative impacts and align with your learning objectives.

#### **Avoid**

- Listing rules without providing meaningful explanations
- Making a faulty assumption that learners know the academic rules
- Creating a syllabus that is overly focused on rules
- Providing a long list of dos and don'ts about classroom behavior
- Adding new rules to prevent any possible problems
- Keeping learners from learning opportunities

### #3 Discussion Boards

- 1. Provide clear expectations
  - Remember many fear writing
- 2. Encourage students to share their thought process and reflections
- 3. Invite students to add questions in their replies
- 4. Consider having students to weave in specific evidence
- 5. Ask how this might related to their practice
- 6. Consider hosting a session to model for students



#### #4 AI Assessments


- Embrace Al
- Enter your assessment into ChatGPT/AI
- Have students demonstrate critical thinking
- Consider having students show the process of their learning
- Application assessments are much harder for ChatGPT/AI to get correct



## #5 Regular and Substantive Interaction (RSI)

- Create a welcome video each term the course is taught
- Keep design and layout of Blackboard consistent and clear
- Are the assessments posted with clear directions and rubrics?
  - Do you provide feedback to help them next time?
- Do students have a chance to provide feedback regularly on the course?
  - Ex. 1 minute paper
    - What stood out to you most in the material this week? Why?
    - What topics require more information or further clarification?
    - What are new questions or unanswered questions?
    - Use this to create the opening for the next unit by responding to it via video, written response, etc.
