William Nganje is a decorated and globally respected professor and chair of agribusiness and applied economics at NDSU.

Nganje has published several journal articles, two books, book chapters and technical reports in food and financial risk analysis and policy. He has won four best journal articles and two national teaching awards, including the best applied economics graduate teaching professor in the U.S. (American Applied Economics Association) in 2022, Western Agricultural Economic Association Outstanding Undergraduate Teacher with less than 10 years' experience in 2005 and the 2010 Best Journal Article Award for Agribusiness, An International Journal.

Nganje has published in several top journals: American Journal of Agricultural Economics; Energy Economics; Ecological Economics; Canadian Journal of Agricultural Economics; Agricultural Finance Review; Journal of Agricultural and Resource Economic; Food Policy; British Food Journal; Journal of International Trade and Development; Agribusiness, An International Journal. He is an associate editor for the International Food and Agribusiness Management Review and a guest editor for the Journal of Risk and Financial Management.

Nganje has given several conference and town-hall presentations on food risks (food safety, food defense and obesity). He came to NDSU in 1998.
