#### **CSWF** – Canan

- Mary Deane Sorcinelli's Visit
  - o The workshops were well taken by the faculty.
  - The session for the deans and VPs was excellent.
  - Evaluation data seems good and well received. The evaluations are posted to the FORWARD website.
  - Dr. Sorcinelli said she was impressed with the NDSU faculty and academic administrators.

  - Don is facilitating the discussion. The topic is mentoring.

- Administrator evaluation group is starting.
  - We will have some information available once the group starts to meet. They will look at example surveys and the current policies pertaining to how often the administrators should/will be evaluated.

# Advocates/Allies - Sean

- There will be an Ally training on Friday, Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>. This session has the largest number of attendees to ever have ever signed up for an ally training session.
- Ally trainings will be offered for the colleges of science and math and arts, humanities, and social science in the future.
- They are continuing the coffee sessions and building case studies and preparing quality tools for the allies.
- Louisiana Tech visit
  - A group of NDSU trainers went in early October and offered 3 training sessions. The trainers assisted Louisiana Tech in shaping an advocate/allies group.
  - Louisiana Tech capped each training session at 12 attendees. There were a total of 36 attendees, all in engineering.
  - o The date was striking. Over 90% agreed with applying new strategies to help women in their department. Overall, the feedback was very positive.

## Climate - Betsy

- Submitted an NSF ADVANCE PAID proposal to study and disseminate the advocates and allies program. It was put together in a short amount of time.
- Working on tip sheets for various people throughout the university. The tip sheets will assist with things to do as a dean or an administrator to improve climate.

# **Evaluation** – Christi

- Larger reports are coming.
  - As the fall semester is winding down, there will be larger reports/documents put together for programming for next year.
- We are trying to publish some of the institution data.
- Laurel Vermillion was here on Monday, Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> and spoke at a pedagogical luncheon and follow-up discussion with administrators.
  - Faculty need some take home points and know how to apply the material discussed from events.
  - Some good suggestions came out of the evaluations, such as bringing in a Latino leader to speak.
  - This pedagogical luncheon was not as heavily attended as others, such as Dr. Pollard's pedagogical luncheon.



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#### **Grant programs** – Canan

- Grant session
  - The session was in mid-October. A very small group attended, but the people who attended thought that it was a very worthwhile and informative session.
- Course release grants
  - There were 6 applicants for fall and spring of next year.
- More grant deadlines are coming up throughout the school year.

## NDSU/UND Speed Networking – Kara

- The networking event was on Friday, Oct. 26<sup>th</sup>. There were a small number of attendees.
- Ann and Kara strategized as to when and where to have other networking events to get a larger attendance.
  - Women in Research (WIR) had a networking event over the lunch hour. That seemed to be the best attended networking event.
  - o May want to partner with WIR for the next networking session.

#### Task Force for Women with Disabilities - Sean

• Met with Provost. They are working on tenure clock extensions, wording for purposes of confidentiality, and the related issues that come with extensions.

#### **Discussion:**

- COACH Survey Results
  - Will be discussed at the meeting in January.
- Institutionalization of FORWARD
  - Role of Internal Advisory Board (IAB) after funding: maintain as is, combine with EAB, develop strategies for appointments, terms, and/or replacements.
    Define roles? Other?
    - The IAB has been really valuable and has had an impressive impact on FORWARD. We need to maintain it somehow.
    - Should we think about combining IAB with the external advisory board? The two groups probably begin to merge, but we do not want it to get too big.
    - The IAB has contributed to many of the FORWARD programs.



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- From the FORWARD side, the IAB has been really helpful/important in getting the word out. FORWARD wants the IAB to be sustained and institutionalized. We would like to be able to replace members that no longer can serve/want to serve.
- The IAB need to know what they want to do or what they can/should do. They need more context as to what their role is/will be in the future.
- Currently we are trying to figure out what the roles of the Vice Provost and FORWARD are.
- IAB may be the body that keeps FORWARD sustained.
- Some of the IAB would like to see FORWARD spill over for graduate students or even for staff.
- We need to look at Budget and at models to keep FORWARD "alive." We really only have been brainstorming, so if you have any ideas let FORWARD know.
  - Email Amy or Betsy with any ideas that would help them with a proposal for the Provost.
  - The proposal needs to be clear about FORWARD's and the Vice Provost roles.
- Budget
  - Grant programs- An idea would be to have college deans match a percentage of grants and possibly have departments match some funds as well.
- Amy and Betsy are developing a two-page draft for the Provost regarding institutionalization of Forward and costs.
  - A 2 page draft is being created.
