Students are invited into the organization each fall based on involvement, leadership experiences, and scholarship.

Our organization promotes several activities in order to foster leadership skills. Each fall we participate in the Charles Thomas Leadership Challenge. The purpose of this challenge is to develop a series of events that will further leadership in the profession of pharmacy. This past fall we proposed a series of events to promote advocacy of pharmacy from students, faculty, and alumni. The residency workshop with its new name being "Next Step Prep" was an opportunity offered to students this past fall semester who were interested in residency program requirements and CV preparation.
