

Agnes Aman – Diploma 1962 Bismarck Hospital School of Nursing

Agnes “Aggie” Pearl Aman, 74, Bismarck, died Aug. 22, 2015, at Sanford Health, Bismarck. A memorial service will be held at 10:30 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 27, at Faith Lutheran Church, Bismarck. Burial will be at North Dakota Veterans Cemetery, Mandan.

Agnes was born to Philip and Emma (Schaeffer) Wanner in McIntosh County on March 20, 1941. Agnes spent her childhood days on the family farm and attended rural school until the eighth grade.
