LPN-BSN Program

LPN to BSN Program Admission Requirements & Process

- 1. Completion of the NLN NACE II (RN-BSN) Exams in the areas of Adult Health, Mental Health, Care of the Child, Care of the Client during Childbearing is required <u>prior</u> to applying to the professional program.
 - a. Passing scores are determined by exam normed data. (Usually around 70%)
 - b. Exams may be taken twice in a calendar year.
 - c. Cost of the exams is subject to change, currently \$35-65/each. Student is responsible for the cost.
 - d. Exams are administered a minimum of twice a year, April and August. Dates are posted on the NDSU School of Nursing website in February and June.
 - e. Exams are Computer-Based, and currently are only available to take at NDSU
- 2. Admission to NDSU (it is recommended the application be submitted by Sept. 1st for spring start).
 - a. Admission to NDSU not required to complete the validation exams (NACE II exams).
- 3. Completed Application, (sent to students after passing all 4 NACE exams) Application deadline: Oct. 15th.
 - a. Includes two References
 - b. Application Fee (currently \$65 but is subject to change)
 - c. Criminal background check (See College of Health Professions Policy 3.08). (\$50.75 fee)
- 4. Professional Nursing Program Requirements
 - a. NLN NACE II exams must be completed with passing score prior to applying to the professional program.
 - b. Graduate with a Diploma in Nursing and completion of 60 or more college/university credits, Associate of Applied Science, or an Associate of Arts or Science.
 - c. Cumulative GPA of a 2.75 or greater and a Nursing GPA of 3.0 or greater
 - d. The completion of the following courses with a "C" or higher:
 - 1. Biology 220/220L & 221/221L: Anatomy and Physiology I and II with lab
 - 2. Microbiology 202/202L: Introduction to Microbiology
 - 3. English 120: College Composition II
 - 4. Communications 110: Fundamentals of Public Speaking
 - 5. Psychology 250: Developmental Psychology
 - 6. Sociology 110: Introduction to Sociology
 - e. Current unencumbered Nursing License as a Licensed Practical Nurse in an eligible state, or must be able to obtain license by May and will be admitted on probation pending licensure.
- 5. Upon admission, students must provide documentation of the following:
 - a. CPR for the Healthcare Provider
 - b. Health Status and required immunization documentation
 - c. FBI background Check with fingerprints (\$25)
- 6. Additional courses will be required for the nursing major including, Chemistry Concepts (Chem 117/L); Biochemistry (Bioc 260); Introduction to Psychology (Psyc 111).

Clinical Requirements (All clinical is in Fargo, ND)

Nursing 360: Health Assessment does have a lab component which may require students to travel to Fargo to complete. Nursing 406: Public Health is completed in the first summer. The course instructor works with students to connect with an agency to complete a project. There is one simulation day. Nursing 407L: Expanded Clinical Practice for the LPN-BSN, in the 2nd summer, has the largest clinical component. Students are in a clinical group with an instructor in the areas of ICU and a medical/surgical unit. Students are provided with clinical dates at least 4 months in advance. Students also have experiences in labor and delivery, emergency department, operating room, pediatrics, and complete 2 days of simulation. Clinical will be two – four days a week for about 6 weeks. Students complete 135 hours of clinical. Nursing 450: Synthesis and Practicum is a capstone course which has 120 hours of clinical.
