Description A recitation that complements PHYS 252 with theory and applications.

Objectives In this recitation, students work individually and in small groups on worksheets and exercises

that emphasize the main concepts of Physics 252. Worksheets are based on Tutorials in Introductory Physics by McDermott, Shaffer, and the Physics Education Group. The emphasis in the tutorials is not on solving the standard quantitative problems, but on the development of important physical concepts and scientific reasoning skills. Tutorial instructor may lecture some, but also will ask questions designed to help students find their own answers. Students

are expected to construct answers for themselves through discussion.

Format The class will involve interactive problem solving with in-class and sometimes home-sent

problem worksheets. There will be interactive in-class activities.
