Degree Requirements & Notes:

Bachelor of Science (BS) Degree – The completion of a minor program of study is required. **Bachelor of Arts (BA) Degree** – Proficiency at the second year level in a foreign language required.

• Of the 28 required credits in French, 15 must be residency credit in addition to the capstone (i.e. taken at NDSU, neither Tri-College, nor study abroad). Note: Other University-wide residency requirements may apply.

AH&SS COLLEGE REQUIREMENT - 12 CREDITS REQUIRED

Courses used to satisfy any general education requirement cannot be used toward AH&SS College Requirements. A minimum of three credits is required in each of the FOUR following areas for a total of 12 credits. Choose only those courses with the prefixes listed for each area. A course with the WGS prefix can only be used in one area.

Area One: Humanities - 3 Credits

ARB, ENGL, FREN, GERM, HIST, HUM, PHIL, RELS, SPAN, or WGS

Area Two: Social Sciences – 3 Credits

ANTH, CJ, COMM, EMGT, POLS, SOC or WGS

Area Three: Fine Arts – 3 Credits

ART, MUSC or THEA

Area Four: Outside Student's Major Area- 3 Credits

Three credits from Area 1, 2 or 3 that is outside the student's major area (i.e. If your major is COMM, the course to fulfill this area cannot be ANTH, CJ, EMGT, POLS, or SOC)
