INSTRUMENTAL TRACK REQUIREMENTS - 24 CREDITS

Major Instrumental Ensemble - 7 Credits

Must enroll in MUSC 303 for 5 semesters and MUSC 111 for 2 semesters. All instrumental music education majors must enroll in 2 semesters of marching band.

Minor Ensembles - 2 Credits

Must be in 2 different semesters as approved by adviser.

Major Choral Ensemble - 2 Credits

MUSC 117 or 306 MUSC 116

Applied Voice - 2 Credits

Performance Attendance - Must enroll for five semesters.

Applied Major Instrument - 7 Credits

All students enrolled in applied instruction must participate in a major ensemble specific to their area. Choose from MUSC 165, 168, 169, 170, 171, or 172.

2 semesters each of 100 level, 200 level, and 300 level

1 semester of 400 level

Applied Piano - 4 Credits - Private or class

Proficiency Waiver:

- Piano proficiency exam must be completed before student teaching.
- Piano credit requirements listed may be waived in whole or in part for successful completion of the piano proficiency.
- Piano majors may fulfill this requirement by accompanying or performance on a secondary medium according to the discretion of the student's applied instructor/advisor.
