## **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS - 13 CREDITS TO REACH 122**

## **Degree Requirements:**

Bachelor of Science (BS) Degree – The completion of a minor program of study is required.

**Bachelor of Arts (BA) Degree** – Proficiency at the second year level in a foreign language required.

#### **Degree Requirements and Notes:**

- Students should refer to <u>www.ndsu.edu/cjps</u> for information regarding application to professional program.
- The department will review applications on a rolling basis. Student must apply to be a major or minor no later than the first day of classes of the semester in which they intend to graduate.
- To apply, a student must have completed a minimum of 36 credit hours upon application and achieve a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the pre-political science courses and 2.75 in all NDSU coursework.
- Once admitted to the professional political science program, failure to maintain a minimum GPA
  of 3.00 in the professional political science courses and a cumulative 2.75 in all coursework will
  result in an academic warning issued from the department for the first violation. Students will
  receive notification of this warning at their NDSU email address. Failure to return to these
  minimum standards will result in being administratively removed from the program.
- Internal and external transfer students will be handled similarly to students who commence their studies in the pre-professional program.
- Students who entered the University and declared political science as their major prior to fall 2012 will be grandfathered into the program and will not be subject to these guidelines.
- These guidelines apply for all majors and minors of political science.
