Area Four: Outside Student's Major Area- 3 Credits

Three credits from Area 1, 2 or 3 that is outside the student's major area (i.e. If your major is COMM, the course to fulfill this area cannot be ANTH, CJ, EMGT, POLS, or SOC)

PROFESSIONAL MAJOR REQUIREMENTS- 28 CREDITS

Of the 28 required credits in Spanish, 15 must be residency credit in addition to the capstone (i.e. taken at NDSU, neither Tri-College, nor study abroad).
