Are you collaborating globally?

Shipping

Do you ship outside the U.S.? Avoid potential fines by contacting Export Control.

Shipping to China, Russia, or Cuba?

An export license or declaration to the U.S. government is required when shipping most items to these countries.

Working with Cuba, Iran, Russia?

You may need special permission from the U.S. government before engaging with these countries.

Visiting Scholars

Hosting scholars from other countries? If they are working on your federally sponsored research, disclosures and/or assignments may be required.

Conflict of Commitment

Many outside professional activities require prior approval, submit a Consulting Authorization request available on the Provost's website.

Are you receiving extramural research funding?

Federal funding agencies are closely reviewing the completeness of disclosures in proposals and through-out the life-cycle of grants and contracts

Be aware of the following updated requirements:

- Other support includes all resources, foreign & domestic, made available to the researcher in support of or related to all of their research endeavors, even non -monetary value support, such as in-kind
- Biographical sketches include positions, scientific appointments, foreign affiliations and honors, including positions which may be voluntary

Significant Financial & Foreign Affiliation disclosures

PI's, senior personnel, and other investigators must disclose related SFI and foreign affiliations.

Are you sharing materials, ideas or information?

Data Integrity

Identify sensitive research data, back-up your data in a secure environment such as a secure cloud server. Unsecured data can be compromised and manipulated, making it unusable.

Transfers and Sharing of Research Materials?

You may need a Material Transfer Agreement (MTA) or a Data Use Agreement (DUA) in place prior to sending or receiving materials or data.

You may need a Technology Control Plan (TCP) or export license prior to sharing items including:

Software, algorithms, encryption code, third-party intellectual property, unpublished data, information not in the public domain or patented information.

Are you traveling internationally?

Data Protection



If you are traveling with electronic devices, you can take the following steps to protect your information:

- Leave your data or laptop at home.
- Back up your data.
- DUO is not allowed in some countries

Your IT administrator can also encrypt your hard drive or set up a Virtual Private Network (VPN).

Travel Safety

Traveling with Research Materials, Samples or Equipment Exports, including items that are handcarried, are subject to legal requirements. Ask the Export Controls Office for assistance.

Field work

- If you are planning to bring research samples back these may require an import permit.
- Be careful about discussing or sharing data or information with international research collaborators.
