Reasons to Ditch Popcorntime and Torrents for Legal Alternatives

College campuses can be hotspots for illegally streaming and downloading copyrighted material. Industry organizations determined to prevent this illegal activity know that's the case. As a result, college students are often on the receiving end of legal notifications to cease and desist

If you or your peers use a website/app to illegally access copyrighted material, here is a reason to stop: *The risk isn't worth the reward.*

Here are some alternatives to consider:

Subscribe to a streaming service such as Netflix or Amazon Prime or purchase individual movies, songs, and TV shows online are easy ways to avoid any legal problems.

NDSU Residence Halls offer ResLife Cinema in each hall, and there's a new list of movies each month. Creative Commons (https://creativecommons.org) is also a good source for a variety of openly licensed media that can be freely shared, used, and remixed.

You receive up to 10% or more than the current market price if we have an order from your professor for the next term. We only buy one term at a time and will be buying for spring classes.

How do I know what books to sell back?

Don't assume you can't sell certain books, bring all of your unwanted course materials to the bookstore and we will let you know their value. Do not sell any RENTAL books.

Check your email!

All rental materials are due to the bookstore by 5:00 on the Friday of finals week Finally we offer a Buyback Bonus where you receive **10% more** at buyback by asking for a gift card instead of cash.

WASTE BUSTERS NUMBERS

The Residence Hall Association (RHA) and Dining did out first round of Waste Busters this year. The goal of the program is to reduce food and liquid waste in the Residence Dining Center. On October 10 and 11, we did a blind tracking of food/liquid waste which becomes our base number. After collecting the numbers, we will focus on teaching students about wasting food in hopes that we will reduce the amount of waste. We are planning to utilize our resources to better enhance student learning on campus. We will create posters that will be uploaded to our Movie Network, we will utilize social media to reach more people on campus as well as small information around the dining centers.

The final numbers with how many students ate per day can be seen down below. We have a good base number set for us and we hope to reduce when we track again.

Food: 326.17 lbs.

Liquid: 184.38 lbs.

Total: 531.35 lbs.

Total number of students: 2,621

Wednesday, October 11th

Food: 414.32 lbs.

Liquid: 184.38 lbs.

Total: 597.7 lbs.

Number of students: 3,101

The total amount of waste for both days was 1.103.05 lbs.
