Summer

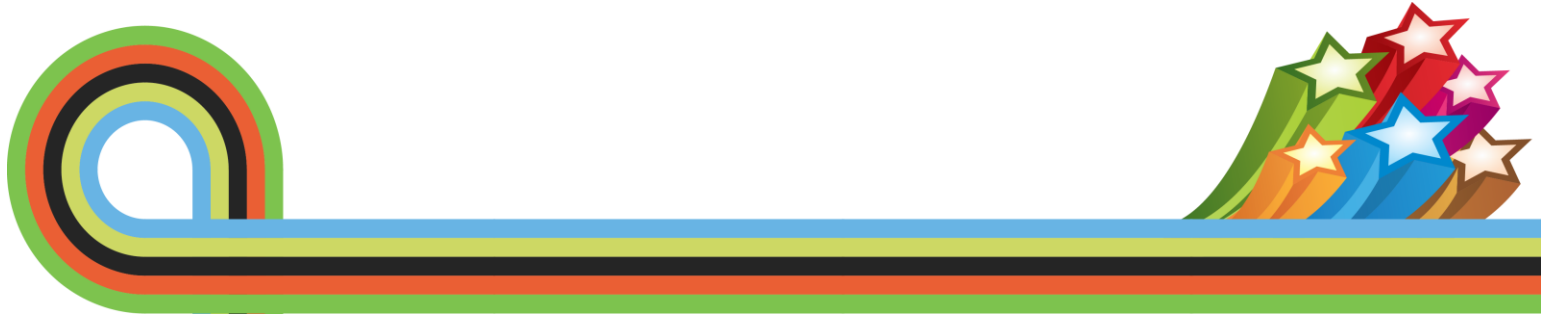
Soc 391 Sociology of Food Ms. Corwin Online

Soc 491 Sociology of Education Dr. Whitsel Mon & Wed 1:00-2:15

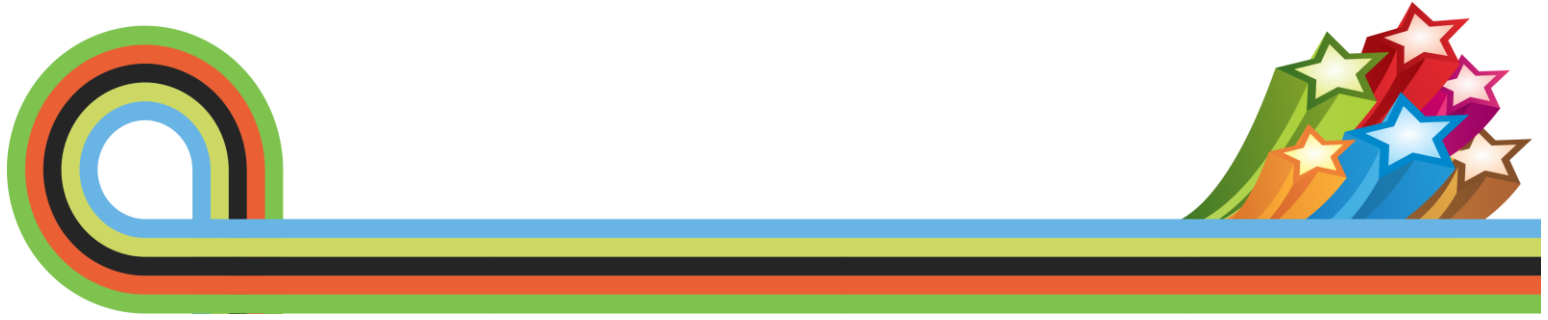
This course will explore the social factors that influence education. The course will cover rural, urban, and international issues.
