Admission into the Accounting Major at NDSU: Students must earn a 'B' or better in ACCT 200 and ACT 201, a 'C' or better in the pre-college and pre-accounting major courses that are indicated with an asterisk (*), achieve junior standing (60 credits), and earn a 2.50 institutional cumulative grade point average. Students must submit an online application to the CoB once admitted into the university. Admission to the accounting major is required to enroll in advanced 300 or 400 level CoB courses.

NOTE: This plan is intended as a guide only and accounts for completion of a AA degree from Bismarck State College prior to entry at NDSU. Program requirements change periodically. It is the student's responsibility to be in contact with advisors from both institutions to obtain the most current program information to help ensure a smooth transfer.

Other course substitutions may be available. Transfer students must meet with NDSU department advisor to review transfer work.

Additional courses may be required to meet credit hour degree requirements.
