# Set up your system ID

Your system ID allows you access to Campus Connection, the online system students use to apply for housing and scholarships, review transfer coursework, view and accept financial aid, and register for classes.

Go to **ndsu.edu/its/new-student** and complete step 1. You'll need your student ID number, which can be found in your admission letter.



# Review your Transfer Credit Report and Academic Requirements Report

Transfer credits are evaluated by the NDSU Office of Registration and Records and are posted to your NDSU account approximately 6-10 weeks following admission. In general, college-level coursework earned from regionally accredited colleges or universities will transfer to NDSU. You'll get an email once credits have been posted.

# TRANSFER CREDIT REPORT

Side-by-side comparison of how your coursework from other institutions has transferred to NDSU.

- 1. Log on to Campus Connection.
- 2. Click on "Student Center," then "My Academics" under the Academics section.
- 3. Click on "View My Transfer Credit Report."

# ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS REPORT

Detailed summary of how your transfer credits have been applied toward your intended program of study and how your previous coursework satisfies requirements such as general education, major/program requirements and free electives.

- 1. Log on to Campus Connection.
- 2. Click on "Student Center," then "My Academics" under the Academics section.
- 3. Click on "View My Academic Requirements Report."

# Apply for Financial Aid

You are encouraged to apply for financial assistance if additional funds are necessary to attend NDSU.

To be considered for financial assistance, submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by April 15 for fall (or at least eight weeks prior to the spring or summer term). Applications are available after January 1 for the following academic year.

Complete the form at **www.fafsa.gov**. NDSU's Institution Title IV Code is 002997.

**NOTE:** If you have already submitted a FAFSA for the academic year you are intending to transfer, you may change your school code using the online form (www.fafsa.gov) or by calling 800-433-3243.

# Apply for NDSU scholarships


Transfer students are encouraged to apply for scholarships if you have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 from each institution previously attended. Preference will be given to students who have earned 24 or more transferable semester credits. Numerous departmental and college scholarships also may be awarded to students based on intended major and academic achievement. To be considered for scholarships, complete the scholarship application by April 1 for fall and summer terms or December 1 for spring term. Some departmental and college scholarships have different deadlines or separate application procedures.

# Review housing options

Transfer students have a variety of housing options available, including on-campus residence halls and student apartments as well as off-campus options. Students beginning at NDSU within one calendar year from the date of high school graduation are required to live on campus and are assigned to (and guaranteed) housing in one of NDSU's first-year student residence halls. Students transferring more than one year after graduating from high school may apply for one of NDSU's upper-division residence halls or student apartments, or also may choose to live off campus.

# Set up your electronic ID

Your electronic ID allows access to your NDSU email account, campus computer clusters and the online student learning system, Blackboard.

Go to **ndsu.edu/its/new-student** and complete steps 2 and 3. You'll need your student ID number.









# Register for classes

NDSU offers a variety of registration options for new transfer students. You may attend one of our on-campus registration programs or choose to enroll in classes on your own. Students are encouraged to consult with an academic adviser and enroll as soon as registration opens for best class selection and availability.

### ACADEMIC ADVISER

Log in to Campus Connection – your academic adviser will be listed on the right-hand side of your "Student Center." If "Department Assigned" is listed or if an adviser has not yet been assigned, refer to the Adviser Contact list at ndsu.edu/fileadmin/transfer/advising-contacts.pdf.

### **ENROLLMENT DATE**

Your enrollment date is the specific date and time you can begin registering for classes for the term you were admitted. Registration usually begins in November for spring semester and April for summer and fall terms. Your enrollment date is listed in your "Student Center" of Campus Connection.

### REGISTRATION

**OPTION 1:** Attend an on-campus transfer orientation/drop-in registration session. Different sessions, specifically designed for transfer students, are offered leading up to the start of each semester. To learn more about specific dates, schedules and to sign up for a session, visit **www.ndsu.edu/studentsuccess/transfer\_students**.

**OPTION 2:** Consult with an academic adviser in your academic department to discuss course selection and register for classes on your own using Campus Connection. Students may contact an adviser via email, phone or a face-to-face meeting. Students may enroll in courses according to their registration appointment.

# ONLINE ORIENTATION

An optional self-guided online orientation also has been developed to supplement your registration options. Information on student services, academic services, student finances and a Campus Connection tutorial can be found online. After activating your electronic ID and password (see Step 1: Electronic Services), go to <a href="https://bb.ndsu.nodak.edu">https://bb.ndsu.nodak.edu</a>, log in and click on "Online Orientation" under "My Courses."

# Apply for reciprocity (Minnesota residents)

Minnesota residents attending NDSU receive a reduced tuition rate similar to that of a North Dakota resident. To qualify for the reduced tuition rate, you must complete the reciprocity application with the Minnesota Office of Higher Education. Forms are available beginning in the spring for the following academic year.

# Get your Bison Card, parking permit and textbooks

# **BISON CARD/STUDENT ID CARD**

Present your official class schedule and picture ID at the Bison Card Center in the Memorial Union to obtain your student ID card ("Bison Card"). Your Bison Card can be used for purchases at a variety of campus locations, to gain access to the Wellness Center, to check out books at the library, to ride the metro-bus for free and to enter athletic events. Students also may use their Bison Card for dining center and residence hall access.


# **PARKING PERMIT**

A permit is required to park on campus. Review more details and how to purchase a permit at **ndsu.edu/parking**. You will need your user ID and password for Campus Connection to purchase a parking permit.

- 1. Log on to Campus Connection.
- 2. Click on "Student Center," then "Parking."
- 3. Select "North Dakota State University" and follow the on-screen instructions.

# FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

If you are currently enrolled at another college or university, please have an official final transcript sent to NDSU upon completion of your studies. This will complete your admission file to the university and ensure all transferable coursework will be evaluated for transfer credit. Failure to provide a final transcript may impact future enrollment at NDSU.
