**Expectations for Quality of Second Draft:** The second draft of your Math 491 paper should be a version of the paper that is complete from your point of view and must incorporate the revisions requested by the instructor and reasonable feedback from your peer review after the first draft. *Your faculty advisor must confirm that the paper is acceptable in this form.* All students must adhere to NDSU Policy 335: Code of Academic Responsibility and Conduct.

**Expectations for Quality of Final Paper:** Your final paper should be a complete, coherent representation of what you have learned in your project during the semester. Your final bibliography should contain at least one mathematics research paper (i.e., your resources should not be all books).

Second Draft Paper Grading: There are two points possible for this task and they will be allocated using the rubric below.

- You will receive 2 points for a draft that is submitted on time and shows reasonable progress.
- You will receive 1 point for a draft that is submitted on time and shows insufficient progress.
- No points will be given for a draft submitted past the due date.

**Final Paper Grading:** There are two points possible for this task and they will be allocated using the rubric below.

- You will receive 2 points for a final paper that is submitted on time, is well-written, is organized, and incorporates all the revisions requested by the instructor and your advisor as well as reasonable suggestions from the peer review
- You will receive 1 point for a final paper that is submitted on time, is poorly written, disorganized, and/or does not incorporate reasonable suggestions from the instructor, advisor, and peer review
- No points will be given for a final paper that is submitted past the due date.
