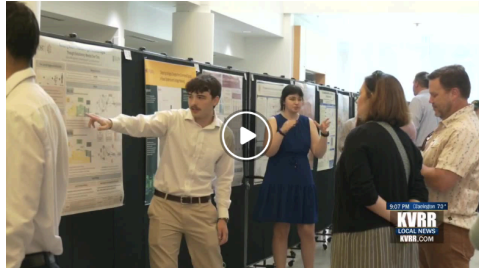
Pavek Hall renovations showcased at Open House
