Enrollment grows as strategic changes reshape the future

NDSU's strategic efforts are driving meaningful progress. After making the hard decision to cut 29 academic programs, the university is seeing growth in key areas: a 3% increase in first-year enrollment and a 3% rise in new transfer students this year. NDSU also saw a 12% increase in undergraduates who received diplomas, reinforcing our role in preparing talent to meet statewide workforce needs.
