# North Dakota 4-H: Building Youth Who Are Beyond Ready

One in four North Dakota youth is learning, leading and thriving through 4-H.



- 6.842 enrolled 4-H members and over 40,000 total youth reached statewide
- 1,387 screened adult volunteers and 71 youth **leaders** support programs
- 439 youth participated in camp where 92% learned something new and 83% of campers made new friends.
- 68 Air Force youth participated in hands-on 4-H learning experiences at 4-H Day on the Grand Forks and Minot Air Force Bases.
- 92% of youth reported 4-H shooting sports taught them to handle equipment more safely.
- Four Engineering Design **Challenge Kickoff events** were held across the state, reaching 69 youth.
- 82 youth participated in the 2025 State 4-H Consumer **Decision Making Contest.**

#### 4-H Makes a Difference

#### Because of 4-H. **Youth Feel Supported** and Connected



- 95% felt respected
- 83% said adults expect them to have a positive future
- 76% believed they would make a difference

### 4-H Builds Life and **Workforce Readiness**



- 92% learned how to act professionally
- 68% said 4-H influenced their ability to care for their emotional health and 71% said the same for their physical health
- 87% reported 4-H influenced their desire to engage in their community 83% credited 4-H with helping them use their time wisely
- 87% reported taking responsibility for their actions, and 85% could be counted on to follow through

## Why Operating Support **Matters**

- Rising costs for travel, training and hands-on learning materials require strong operating support to keep high-quality youth programs accessible statewide.
- Participation is growing more youth, more volunteers, more exhibits—requiring a reliable infrastructure to sustain safe, high-impact learning in all 53 counties.
- Operating support prevents rising program costs (transportation, supplies, food) from shifting to families, ensuring 4-H remains affordable and equitable.
