

SBARE ASK: Program Support Funds for

Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR)

An increase in operating funds is needed to sustain ND's agricultural leadership. These funds allow us to "Take the University to the People"—turning research into real-world results in every county.

Operating funds lag behind costs for travel, materials, printing and training. Recruiting and developing new agents requires sustained investment. Without increased support, Extension's ability to deliver high-impact programming will be limited.

North Dakota Agriculture: Strengthening Our Future



Agriculture Powers North Dakota

- \$41 billion annual contribution to the state economy
- 24,000+ farmers and ranchers driving rural prosperity
- ND ranks #1 nationally in spring wheat, durum, canola, rye, oats, flaxseed, sunflower, edible beans and honey
- **Top producer** in sugarbeets (#3), potatoes (#5), soybeans (#8), beef cattle (#8) and corn (#10)

Real Economic Returns from Your Investment

- Soybeans: +2 bu/acre × 6.7M acres x \$9.50/bu= \$125 million added farm income
- Spring wheat: +10 bu/acre × 5.26M acres x \$5.50/bu= \$300 million value increase
- Total: \$425 million in new income reinvested in ND communities.

Diversification and Innovation

Producers are **diversifying** with sunflower, dry edible beans, peas, lentils, and chickpeas. **Value-added processing**—like ethanol and soybean crushing—creates local jobs and keeps profits in-state. **Collaboration** with the North Dakota Department of Agriculture and commodity groups keeps North Dakota competitive and innovative.

The Human Impact of Extension

- 8,000+ trainings and 150,000 participants statewide
- Farmers improving yields and cutting costs with nitrogen calculator
- Master Gardeners: 60+ pollinator gardens, 23,000 lbs of produce donated
- **Disaster response:** Support after blizzards, wildfires, EF5 tornado and data used to get federal disaster aid.
- Livestock insurance education: \$12M in producer indemnities
- 4-H youth: 40,188 North Dakota youth trained
