NDSU begins search for next President

NDSU has launched the search for its next president following the announcement that President David Cook will depart in March to become president of Iowa State University. Nominations and applications are open through Monday, Feb. 16, with interviews scheduled throughout March and finalist campus visits set for March 23–27.

The State Board of Higher Education is expected to select the next permanent president during a special meeting the week of March 30, 2026.

The next president will work closely with North Dakota legislators to advance priorities that strengthen the state's workforce, economy and communities. The Presidential Search Committee is co-chaired by State Board of Higher Education Chair Kevin Black and NDSU Chief of Staff Jace Beehler, and includes representatives from across the campus and community.

NDSU and Gateway to Science launch partnership

NDSU and North Dakota's Gateway to Science have launched a partnership to expand hands-on STEM learning for K-12 students across the state, with an emphasis on rural access. By combining NDSU expertise with mobile outreach, the effort builds early interest in science and technology and strengthens North Dakota's future workforce.
