Interim NDSU president selected

The State Board of Higher Education selected Rick Berg as interim president of NDSU on Jan. 22. Berg, a Hettinger native and NDSU alum with a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics, began the role Monday. He brings leadership experience across public service and the private sector, including service in the North Dakota

House of Representatives and the U.S. House of Representatives, plus work in real estate and development.

Berg said his priorities are to continue the university's forward momentum, work collaboratively with legislators actively reviewing the funding formula and support a smooth transition for the permanent president.

NDSU to host AgTech Hackathon

NDSU will host its AgTech Hackathon Feb. 20–22 at the NDSU Peltier Complex, partnering with Bayer Crop Science and the National Science Foundation AgTech Engine to bring graduate students, postdoctoral researchers and research staff together to work in teams on real-world agricultural and biological data challenges. Participants will analyze complex datasets, develop solutions and present to a panel of judges from academia and industry in this competition designed to strengthen analytical and problem-solving skills across agronomy, data science, engineering and related fields.

NDSU joining Mountain West Conference

NDSU has accepted an invitation for its football program to join the Mountain West Conference as a football-only affiliate member and compete at the Football Bowl Subdivision level beginning July 1, a move that reflects years of planning and aligns with long-term institutional goals around academic reputation, research engagement and national visibility. University officials have emphasized that no public funds will be used at this time to support the transition, with costs to join and reclassify being met through philanthropy and athletics generated revenue sources.
