Bison to the Bakken returns for year two

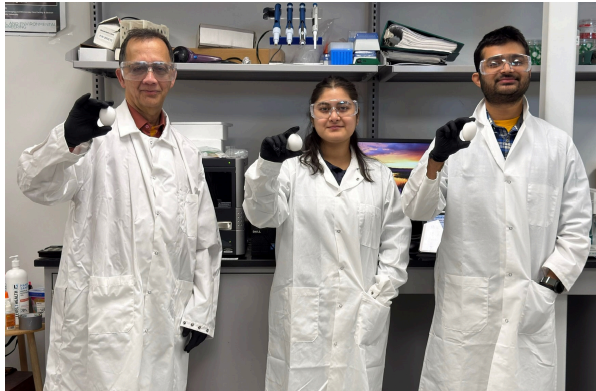
