95% of NDSU graduates achieve career success after graduation

NDSU graduates continue to deliver strong outcomes for North Dakota's workforce and economy. A recently released career outcomes report found that 95% of 2025 graduates were employed or continuing their education within six months of graduation. While 86% of North Dakota graduates remained in the state, NDSU also serves as a significant importer of talent, attracting students from across the region and helping retain them in North Dakota after graduation. Approximately 1,000 NDSU graduates enter the state's workforce each year, helping fill critical talent needs in healthcare, education, engineering, agriculture, business and other high-demand areas.

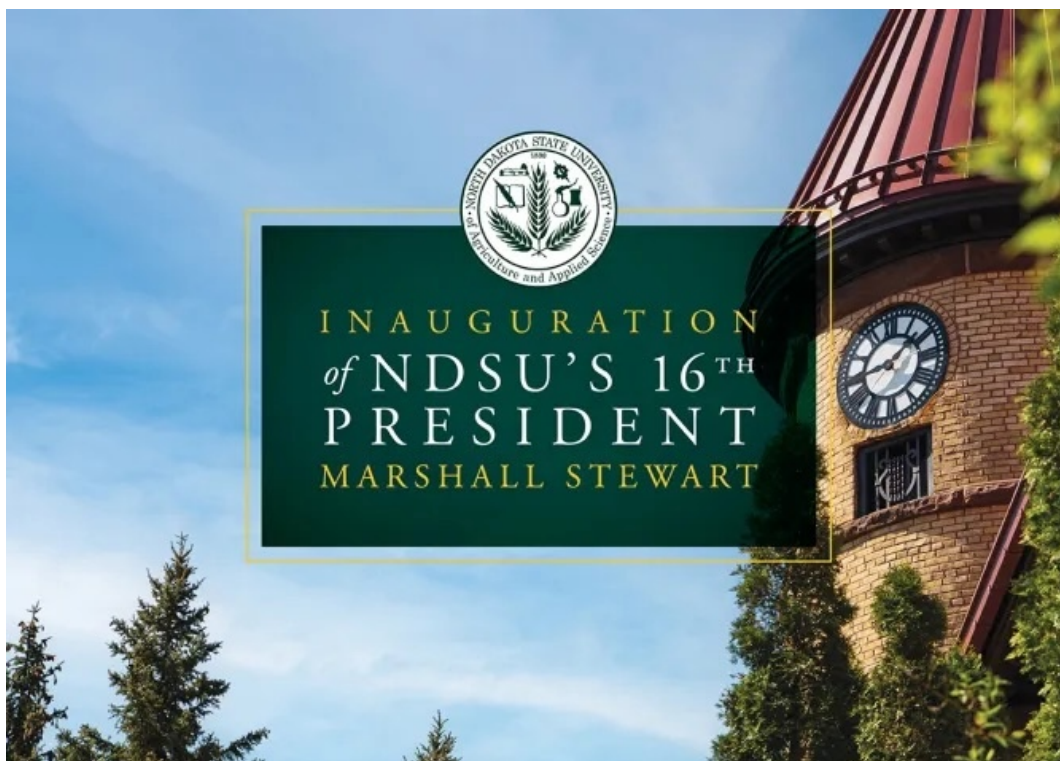
