NDSU alumnus selected to lead North Dakota Health and Human Services

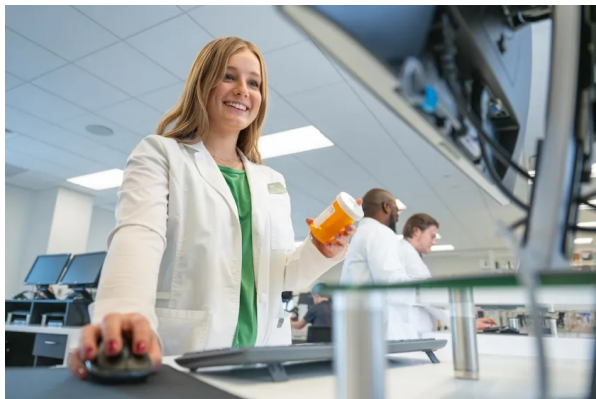

for NDSU students while serving communities across the state.

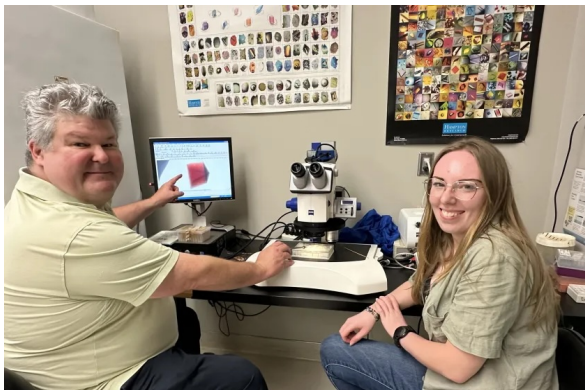
